A portfolio does not take the place of a resume, but it can accentuate your abilities and what you can offer in the chosen field.

Always be as specific as possible. Your portfolio can become quite a large collection of materials. For interview purposes, it would be a wise strategy to select items from your portfolio to be included in a smaller interview portfolio. The smaller portfolio can be presented during the interview and would be less overwhelming to the interviewer.

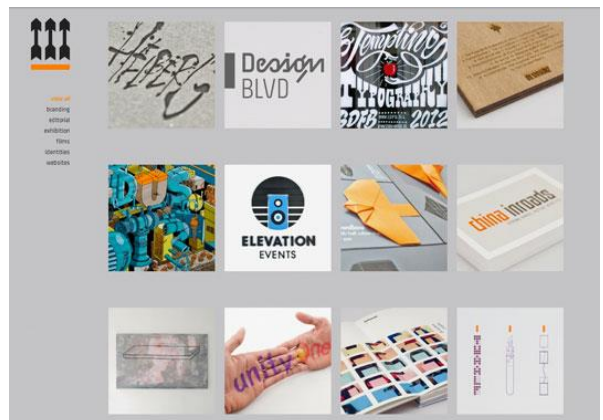
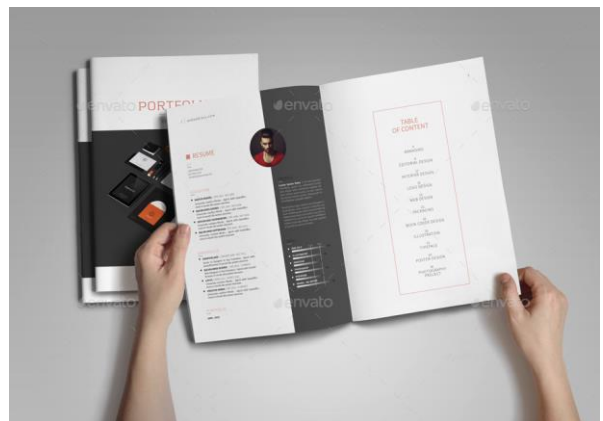

- Size: A4.
- DPI: 300
- Color: CMYK
- Portfolio page: 12 pages and above
- Bleed: Your design may bleed. Note: You do not need to increase your InDesign document size to bleed.
- Media: InDesign with original images from Photoshop and/or Illustrator.
- **You must use InDesign for your layout for this assignment.**
- **You must complete all of your text in InDesign.**
- **You may use Photoshop or Illustrator to complete your headline and image**
- **Your portfolio have to conduct with 1 page of CV and 1 page of content/index in your portfolio.**
- **Portfolio cover must print on 230gms art card, and inner page print with 108gms art paper.**
- All assignments must be typed, double spaced, and turned in on time on the due date. **NO LATE ASSIGNMENTS WILL BE ACCEPTED.** Lecturer does not accept late work for ANY reason. No exceptions.
